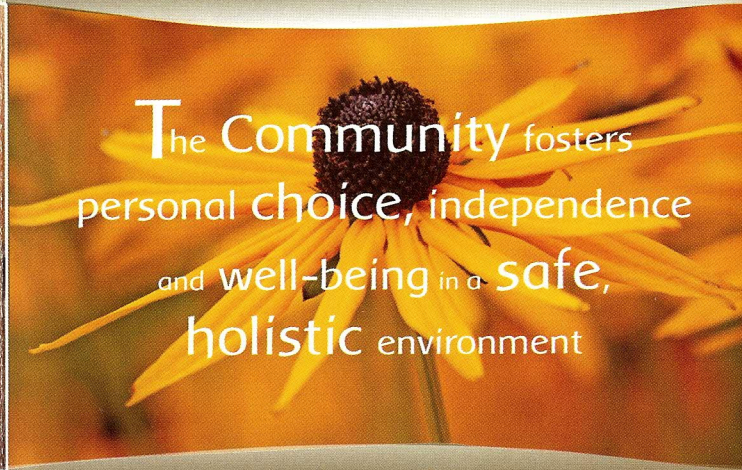

There are now over 100 Camphill Communities in 23 countries around the world providing a unique approach to the care of adults and children with special needs.

Clanabogan is home to 30 vulnerable adults who benefit from all the opportunities offered by the Community. An additional number of people also attend the day care service. We aim to provide integrated care and support which meets individual needs and promotes inclusion in society.
