Practical training

Professional clinical practice (training) is organized according to the plan of the practical training, under the guidance of the teacher in charge of that year's education and the guarantors of professional experience from the Department of Nursing and Midwifery. Each teacher teaches his/her specialty and is responsible for the clinical supervision during the practical experience. The teachers guide the students during the clinical practice. Experienced practitioners (an assistant from the clinical practice) who will participate in student education are skilled in English language. They are qualified experts in their disciplines, and have an appropriate training for the mentor's role. The clinics for the practical experience are chosen according to the established standards and meet the set standard criteria, the validity of which is confirmed by a contract.

Individual practical training

The goal of the subject is to obtain experience needed for the professional development and understanding the differences in meeting needs of healthy, ill, handicapped and dying clients/patients in various developmental periods. Students do practical training in the facilities of primary, secondary and tertiary care, and extend their practical and theoretical knowledge and skills needed for providing the complex nursing care, participate in the cooperation within the nursing team, respect and adhere to valid acts and standards. The Log book (a guide through the practical experience) is an educational tool for the achievement of personal and educational goals. It contains summarizing information on the preparation and course of the practical experience. It enables the students to acquire individual competences and nursing interventions at the individual units within the educational plan, i.e. primary, secondary and tertiary care, and nursing educational activities.

Structure of practical training

1ST YEAR

The clinical practice is focused on the areas of health promotion and prevention of diseases - primary care and the phase 1 of the nursing process, elaboration of the case studies of inpatients. Students learn about the structure of primary care duties (shifts) and individual kinds of primary care facilities. They learn how to assess the (material and social) environment where the clients live, their health risks, types of diseases occurring in the particular environment demanding preventive measures, and methods of both individual and group education. They learn how to assess the clients' health and needs from the point of view of nursing care.

2ND YEAR

The practical experience will be focused on the areas of secondary and tertiary care and the specifics of nursing process at individual units. Furthermore, it will be focused on the development of case studies and an individual care plan in selected clients.

3RD YEAR

The practical experience is focused on the area of primary, secondary and tertiary care. Students learn to provide home care, and care at basic and special nursing units using nursing process. Students extend their knowledge of providing individual nursing care at facilities of various kinds and types of care.
